Stephen opened the meeting at 7:07 pm. Eugene read the minutes from the previous meeting and moved for adoption as read. Seconded by Doug J.

## Old Business:

- **Anti-Littering Signs:** Ron sent his regrets on missing the meeting but passed on new information via Eugene. Ron's new contact in Halifax had not called him back in about a month so he called her again. She is mailing him an application form to fill out requesting funding etc. She also asked that we change the printed logo of DOE to another series of letters. She'll send that info as well. They will cover up to \$500.00 – 100%, after that it would be a shared cost. Although it is too late for this spring's fishing season, we feel strongly that we should have them made now and they'll be ready to post before the next fishing season arrives,. However, there are still areas that could use one of these signs regardless of our fishing season, so we hope to be able to post some as soon as possible.
- **Earth Day:** Stephen's letter was printed in the Bulletin, and Vernon Oickle did a follow-up article, as he said he would, addressing the littering problems we are all well aware of.
- **SSWA Website:** Nothing new to report on this topic. It will take some time. Plus we're paid up in the old domain until Feb. 2014 so we might as well use it.
- **Amy Campbell's Request:** No further communication here either. Bruce reported to Stephen that DNR and Parks Canada biologists have tried unsuccessfully twice before to introduce caribou so it is not likely they will be too eager to have another go at it. With the added responsibility of the Bowater's land purchase and their own budget cuts, this item may not make the list.
- **Fishing Derbies Report:** We completed three successful outings at the MARC by this meeting. The first was held on April 27'th for Big Brothers/Big Sisters. It was a very cool day so trout were not as aggressive as some times, but in the end almost 50 fish were landed, cleaned, bagged and stored for the participants. Members Doug Joudrey, Gerry Read, Barry Kelly, Eugene and Sheila, Stephen and

Linda, Ron Thompson, Reg Archibald, and Greg Himmelman all took part to help make another great event for the 'littles'. We provided the typical refreshments, including hot drinks which were a big hit because of the cool temperature. MLA Pam Birdsall and her husband, taking time out from a busy schedule to acknowledge our efforts, graciously dropped by for a brief visit and a quick try for a trout. SSWA presented each participant with a certificate, and Barry Kelly again generously donated hats for all of them on behalf of our club. - --

- Four days later we held an outing for CSSG (Community Services Support Group) from 9:00am until 1:00, followed by a new undertaking for us – Supported Community Living Options – from 2:00 until 5:00pm. Both of these were a lot of fun and very popular with SSWA and the approximately 50 participants in total from the two groups. Again, the fishing was a bit slow, but by the end of the day between 70 – 80 trout were taken. SSWA was well represented and a lot of thanks goes to the members who helped out for the whole day: the three Rons - Thompson, Seney, and Gardener, Doug Joudrey and Doug Barry, Reg Archibald, Greg Himmelman, Eugene and Stephen. Of special note is that we signed up one new member because of our involvement with these fishing outings. He was impressed with our club and paid his dues right there that day.

There remains one more fishing event to do for Bridgewater Elementary School on May 15'th.

- **Lyme Disease Education:** Stephen will try contacting Pam Birdsall to see if she can recommend any further action on the part of SSWA. In the meantime Eugene will prepare a handout covering the points reported in our last minutes and have them available for the Michelin Health & Safety Fair in June. Here they are again for anyone interested:
  - first detected in Lunenburg in 2003
  - by 2012 there were also known established areas in Pictou, Bedford, Liverpool and Yarmouth
  - vaccine 'LIMERIX' only marketed from 1998 – 2002, withdrawn by the company
  - in Europe they are experimenting with a vaccine for animals but a human one is a long way off
  - our fluctuating temperatures do not force them into dormancy
  - impression has been given to NS Health and Wellness that the public is tired of hearing about Lyme
  - residents in deemed newly infected zones are notified in the mail through the Municipality
  - local physicians are brought up to date annually on stats, treatments, infected areas, etc
  - bull's eye rash does not appear in every case
  - treatment for Lyme requires oral intake twice daily for 21 days, and is not good for the stomach
  - Lyme can be acquired any number of times despite successful treatments previously
  - all agreed more info should be conveyed to the public, but the need does not appear to be there
